Horch, G.B.J. (1981). *Rice: Fact or fiction?* Buffalo, NY: Capen Group.

In his seminal work, Horch examines the mythological, religious, and practical significance of the world's most popular staple. This book is indispensable for anyone in grain studies or a similar milieu; the diversions into Victorian flatware are not.

One! is a film adaptation of the stage musical based on Lord Cedric Montdore's autobiography. The film gleefully ignores historical accuracy in favor of a satirical view of England between the World Wars, and ends with an epilogue noting Montdore's death from a poisoned tin of tomato soup. Fabulous, and particularly interesting for fans of Rhys Bowen's recent series about Lady Georgiana Rannoch.
